MESSAGE FROM OUR MINISTER

Reflections on...

“It’s February Already?!”

January is almost over as I write this, though I can hardly believe it, and by the time you read this we’ll be into February. For me, that means it’s time for my appointment with the orthopedic doctor who will tell me if my foot is healing well. If I’m careful and lucky and graced, sometime in February I’ll be able to walk without this boot/brace thing on my leg! (And even drive my car!)

For the Brockport UU Fellowship, this month brings a service on February 6th devoted to our 5th Source “the Humanist teachings which counsel us to heed the guidance of reason and the results of science” and to Charles Darwin’s theory of evolution, and a service on February 20th led by the Rev. Richard Gilbert, Minister Emeritus at the First Unitarian Church in Rochester and the Social Justice Coordinator for the St. Lawrence UU District. I don’t yet know his topic, but this will be a wonderful opportunity to hear one of the most respected UU ministers of our time. Rev. Gilbert is the author of two books on social justice (*The Prophetic Imperative: Social Gospel in Theory and Practice* and *How Much Do We Deserve?: An Inquiry in Distributive Justice*), the adult religious education curriculum *Building Your Own Theology*, and numerous meditation booklets.

And then, of course, February brings Valentine’s Day. The UU Association of Congregations is encouraging us to re-imagine Valentine’s Day as National Standing on the Side of Love Day, a holiday of love and acceptance for everyone. 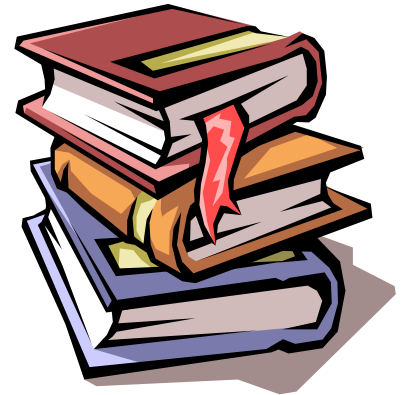

February 8th: **March** by Geraldine Brooks—a novel that imagines the life of Mr. March, the absent father in Louisa May Alcott's *Little Women*; set against the Civil War, *March* portrays a young, idealistic northerner (and neighbor of Emerson and Thoreau) who is drastically changed by his experiences as an Army chaplain in the South.

March 8th: **The Death of Josseline: Immigration Stories from the Arizona Borderlands** by Margaret Regan—the stories of the people caught up in the struggle along the border between Mexico and Arizona, from the migrants desperate for work and a better life to the Border Patrol agents who track them and the activists who provide humanitarian aid in the desert

The Death of Josseline has been chosen by The UU Association as a “common read”, and they are encouraging all the 1000+ congregations throughout the country to read and discuss it. In our area, the five UU congregations in our cluster: Albion, Brockport, Canandaigua, and the two in Rochester, will all be invited to attend our book group discussion AND to participate in a potluck dinner and discussion at First Universalist Church in Rochester on Friday, March 11th. There was a cluster potluck there a few years ago (before BUUF existed!) and it was wonderful, so put this date on your calendar! And you are welcome to come to the potluck even if you don't read the book; but, the book does a great job of making the immigration issue understandable and personal and real.

Remember, we meet the second Tuesday of each month from 6:30 to 8 p.m. at the Lift Bridge Book Shop at 45 Main Street in Brockport, and the Book Shop offers a 20% on book club purchases.

David Markham and I welcome your suggestions for books to discuss over the coming year. We try to choose a variety of books, both fiction and nonfiction, that will enable us to explore spiritual topics, current events, and Unitarian Universalist values. We also try to choose books that are available in paperback and in the Monroe County Library system and that are a reasonable size (say, 250 pages or less).

SMALL GROUP MINISTRY – SOUL TALK

SGM (Small Group Ministry) is a way to explore your spirituality more deeply, in a more intimate and confidential setting, with 5 to 7 people in a group. The group meets monthly and once a group is formed, bonds build. New participants are VERY welcome to join, but we ask that you make a commitment to attending regularly. Questions for the Meeting on Thursday, February 3. These questions are meant to get you thinking about the topic. Don't feel you have to answer every question, just see where your thinking and feelings take you.

Topic: our 5th Source: Humanist teachings, which counsel us to heed the guidance of reason and the results of science, and warn us against idolatries of the mind and spirit.

1. Do you think of reason and science as good sources upon which to draw for wisdom, inspiration, and guidance in your life?
2. Considering scientific knowledge in a broad sense, for example, knowing something about the distance of the stars in the night sky, or the ways a plant's seeds are scattered so that it can reproduce itself, can you think of a time when scientific knowledge has been a religious source for you?
3. What part has reason played in your religious or spiritual life? Do you feel that you have followed your heart more than your thinking, or has reason been more important than feelings? Can you think of a time when reasoning has changed your religious journey?
4. Humanism can be defined as a way of understanding the world in natural rather than supernatural terms. Many UUs are humanists, often defining it in a religious way, for example, finding a sense of wonder in nature, and looking to humanity for the compassion and the sense of responsibility that will bring increasing good to the world. (If you'd like to check out some websites about humanism, try www.humanists.org and www.iheu.org.) To what extent would you describe yourself as a humanist? Solidly humanist? Not at all? Or at what point in the middle?

A CALL FOR "CHALICE LIGHTERS"

"Chalice Lighters" is a program dedicated to the growth of Unitarian Universalist congregations in the St. Lawrence District (thirty-four congregations across New York State, except the New York City area, and into Pennsylvania). THANKS TO THE BROCKPORT FIREMEN'S EXEMPT ASSOCIATION

On behalf of the Steering Committee and Congregation of the Brockport Unitarian Universalist Fellowship, Jean Sauberan, Corresponding Secretary, delivered a letter of appreciation, and the key to the building, to the Brockport Firemen's Exempt Association. The letter was addressed to the Board of Directors and asked them to accept our sincere thanks for the assistance they provided our Congregation during its first year and a half of life; and let them know that without their graciousness and generosity, allowing us to rent the wonderful space, for a reasonable rate, we probably would not have been able to grow our church, as we have.

The letter explained that in October 2010, an opportunity presented itself that BUUF needed to explore. A space became at the Garland United Methodist Church, which recently merged with the Brockport United Methodist Church. Negotiations took place over the next two months; and, on December 31, 2010, The Brockport United Methodist Church Board of Trustees ratified a rental plan with the Brockport Unitarian Universalist Fellowship, for the use of the historic Garland United Methodist Church. But, because of the holidays, the contract was not finalized until January 14, 2011. The letter further stated that we moved in and held our first service on January 16, 2011; and, that this dedicated spiritual space is perfect for the next growth phase of our congregation. Their Board of Directors accepted the letter and key and wished us well.

VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITY

RAIHN, stands for the Rochester Area Interfaith Hospitality Network. It is a consortium of 15 faith communities that host families in temporary need of housing, and 25 faith communities that provide volunteers and other support to the host congregations. First Universalist is a host congregation, supported by St. Mary's. Four times a year, for a week each time, volunteers from both congregations work together to provide a welcoming, safe place for these families to come home to after a day at the RAIHN Center where they get help looking for housing and, for some, new employment. We prepare and serve a hot evening meal, help with homework, offer a lap, a story and a hug, a listening ear, a word of encouragement, overnight presence, breakfast and whatever else might be needed before the families return to their jobs or to the Center for another day of hard work.

RAIHN Training: On any given night in Rochester, some 300 people are homeless, many of them children. Families are the fastest growing segment of the homeless population. You can nurture the spirit, serve the community and be a source of hope to homeless families by becoming a RAIHN volunteer. On Tuesday, February 8, Nancy Elliott, Director of the Rochester Area Interfaith Hospitality Network (RAIHN), will lead a training session from 7 until 9 PM at the Irondequoit United Church of Christ, 644 Titus Avenue,

for those interested in volunteering for RAIHN. Training sessions orient folks to the philosophy of RAIHN and provide skills in building appropriate relationships with our guests. Those attending learn how families are selected, what is expected of the volunteers and the guests, and how to be helpful. Ample time is provided for questions and discussion.

Volunteers are expected to attend a training session prior to volunteering for the first time. Attending training does not obligate you to volunteer, but we hope you'll feel inspired. And you'll be qualified to volunteer when you're ready.

These sessions are valuable for seasoned volunteers as well. You can enrich the orientation with your experiences and can learn what's new at RAIHN. All are welcome! We hope to see you there!

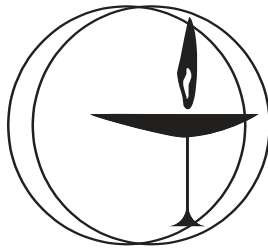
