MESSAGE FROM OUR MINISTER

Reflections on “Each One Bring One!”

If you were at church for our canvass kickoff you already know what a wonderful St. Patrick’s Day lunch we enjoyed. Many thanks to Matt for his generosity and hard work!! And you also know that I auctioned off a t-shirt that brought in \$75 for the first contribution to our campaign—not because it had gold decorations or anything, but because the person who bought it auctioned it off a second time, and it ended up being sold four times!

Our challenge this year is to maintain or grow our budget without the \$8,000 Chalice Lighters grant we received last year. There are two ways to do that: we increase our financial contributions and we grow our membership. Our Stewardship Team is doing a great job of presenting the financial information, and I’m announcing an “Each One Bring One” campaign. If each of us brings at least one person (or three or four or more) to BUUF sometime this month or next month, we could easily get to 50 members, which was the goal we stated in our Chalice Lighters grant application.

We don’t want to grow just for growth’s sake. Let’s grow because we have something wonderful here, both in Unitarian Universalism and in our Brockport UU community, and because we want to share that with more and more people. Let’s grow because our faith offers a way of life that people need and that our world needs!

Check out all that’s happening this coming month—celebrations of spring and Easter, reflections on issues ranging from water and the earth to immigration, and opportunities throughout to find both meaning and new ways to love this world—and consider bringing a friend, neighbor, or family member. It’s growing season for BUUF.

April 10th: *Amish Grace* by Donald B. Kraybill, Steven M. Nolt, and David L. Weaver-Zercher—an exploration of the forgiveness extended by the Amish after a gunman killed five children and injured five others in a one-room school in Nickel Mines, Pennsylvania, in October 2006.

May 8th: *Ghostbread* by Sonja Livingston—a memoir by a local author about growing up poor, white, fatherless, and one of seven children in the bleak and mostly hidden poorer neighborhoods of Western New York during the 1970s. The author will visit with our book group from 6:30 to about 7:15.

Remember, we meet the second Tuesday of each month from 6:30 to 8 p.m. at the Lift Bridge Book Shop at 45 Main Street in Brockport, and the Book Shop offers a 20% on most book club purchases.

Chaplain Trainings are small working conferences designed for youth and advisors to gain skills centered on the skills needed to effectively listen to, affirm, and emotionally support conferees at youth events. Chaplains are individuals who help manage crises, ensure a healthy and safe atmosphere, and bring spiritual resources and support to the community.

The Chaplain Training focuses on the following:

- Understanding confidentiality — when to keep and when to break safety concerns
- Maintaining appropriate personal boundaries (physical, emotional, etc.)
- Perceiving and responding to the needs of the conference community as a whole
- Developing communication skills: active listening, non-verbals, etc.
- Being an empathetic listener, understanding and accepting different emotional situations
- Working as a team with other chaplains, worship planners, and conference staff
- Legal and ethical considerations to ensure a safe and healthy conference community
- Responsible, intentional and culturally appropriate use of worship materials

Working on Farms in Upstate New York

Tom Rivers, the author of "Farm Hands" will come to the Newman Center, SUNY Brockport to offer his reflections on his experience working side by side with farm workers in harvesting and other settings. He will talk about how difficult the work is, even for a former college varsity athlete in reasonably good shape.

He'll describe the courage, industriousness, kindness of those with whom he worked. His book has been a huge success nationwide. In addition, folks who came here on the migrant circuit and stayed, will tell their personal stories and a farmer that employs them will also speak on how skilled and dependable the workers are.

Come April 16th at 7PM to the Newman Center in Brockport to understand the humanity of these people, learn to appreciate all they do, and let it open a door to understanding the teachings of many religious traditions when it comes to seeking justice and fairness as it applies to migrant workers.
