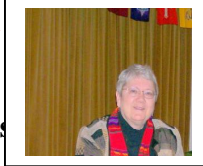

Reflections on the Mid-Winter Holidays

The days grow shorter, the light less. There is a saying in the Talmud, “A small amount of light pushes away much darkness.” And so it is, as holiday lights enliven dark streets, or the glow of a Christmas tree or the light of candles lights a dark room.

By the time you read this we will already have celebrated the first Sunday in Advent and begun our discussion of the meanings of Christmas and of the ancient mid-winter holidays that lie behind and within it. On December 4th we’ll honor the milestones of the past year—the births, deaths, and other events that have changed our lives and that we carry into the holidays. On the 18th we’ll re-enact a British folk-tale, “St. George and the Dragon,” that has been a part of mid-winter revels for centuries. On Friday night, December 23rd, we’ll enjoy some special Christmas music along with what promises to be a wonderful celebratory dinner. And on Sunday morning, December 25th, I’ll be at church to join with whoever else wants to share in celebration and reflections on Christmas morning.

In this season of festivities and joy, not all of us are joyful. We are challenged by the stresses of our over-produced, overly-consumer-oriented Christmas, by questions about meaning, and by other life issues—money, health, family, loved ones who are no longer with us. If the holidays are difficult for you, please be in touch (at 224-6312). I’m always ready to listen. If you are yearning for community and meaning, let’s make it together!

And so we go forward into the darkness of mid-winter, knowing the light will return, knowing there are many blessings in the season.

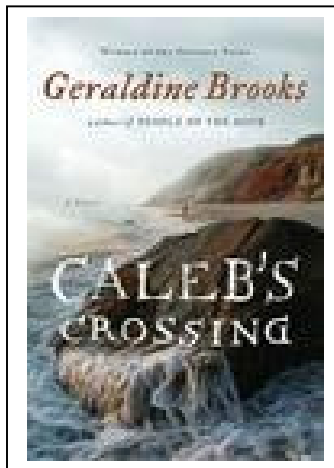

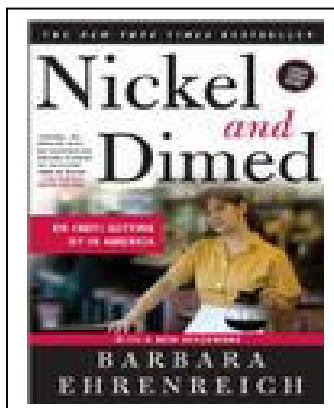

Then, on **Wednesday, December 7**, you or someone from your organization can bring all items to the Main Ballroom in the Seymour College Union for “Collection/ Sorting Day”. Volunteers will be on hand at this site between the hours of 8:00 AM and 5:00 PM to organize items, prior to their distribution to the local community.

Hello Brockport Church Members and Friends:

Thank you all for the great job you did collecting food for the holiday baskets !!

We served 175 families

I am sure by now you have all heard that the Brockport Ecumenical Food Shelf has moved and changed the way we do things. If you haven't heard, now you have!

Once again if anyone knows of a family in need of food assistance, please refer them to The Food Shelf.

We are now located in the basement of St. Luke's Episcopal Church at 14 State Street (use the State Street entrance) and have open hours 3 days a week. For your information our hours are Mondays: 10:00-1:00; Wednesdays: 1:00-4:00 and Thursdays: 5:00-8:00. Clients are required to bring a current utility bill (each visit) a photo ID and birth certificates for their children at their first visit. The requirements are similar, must live in 14420 or 14430 and can receive food assistance once every 4 weeks.
